### 1. Housekeeping

## a. Review and Approval of Minutes

Mary A. Smith, Administrative Coordinator to the Faculty Assembly, noted two errors. Matthew Weinstein moved to approve the edited minutes from March 12, 2015; Tyler Budge seconded. 4 members voted in favor unanimously.

### b. Update: Executive Council (need sub for 4/8)

No member will able to attend the 4/8 EC meeting. There are no updates because EC has not met since the last FAC meeting.

### 2. Growth: Faculty Work Load

#### a. Email contacts: status

Faculty noted a low response rate from the folks that they contacted. It is possible that there are activities that folks do not want shared and/or because they feel they have a low amount of service. Part of the report narrative will be that 3/5 of folks contacted did not respond or declined.

The question was raised as to why the annual activity report is not being used in this review. Program administrators are able to give faculty members information regarding campus service and tri-campus service, but not concerning service off-campus.

#### b. Initial review of Curriculum Vitae (CV)

Faculty speculated that some CVs are not up-to-date; therefore people do not want to respond until they have updated. The committee agreed to pursue their investigation with information up through May 2014.

#### c. Thoughts about follow up?

Anne Wessells asked members to come to meeting on April 16<sup>th</sup> with as much information as possible. Through discussion, the committee will review on alternative methods.
