## **Course Description**

We will watch the first season of the television series Mr. Robot (2015) in order to consider how the series is a contemporary work of cyberpunk. Cyberpunk is subgenre of science fiction that often follows the format of classic detective fiction, with the addition of technological themes: hackers fighting mega-corporations, post-industrial dystopian society, the low-life side of a high-tech society, and the impact of cybernetics and information technology. We will read and watch other works of cyberpunk, such as William Gibson and Blade Runner, to better understand Mr. Robot and why it is not set in the future, but the present day. Are we now living in the dystopian future depicted by classic cyberpunk? Does science fiction still need to take place in the future? Students new to science fiction are encouraged to enroll.

#### Core

The Core program consists of a coordinated series of courses that represent the various disciplines in the university. This course, along with the others in your cohort, fulfills one of the university's general education requirements in each of the areas of knowledge plus composition. The courses are designed to both support and challenge you to develop the critical thinking, writing, research, and analytical skills you'll need at UWT while introducing you to relevant topics in the social sciences, humanities, and sciences.

Core Student Learning Goals

- inquiry & problem solving: collect, evaluate, and analyze information and resources to solve problems or answer questions.
- analysis: identify, analyze, and summarize/represent the key elements of a text.
- synthesis & context: make meaningful connections among assignments and readings in order to develop a sense of the 'big picture.'
- global perspective: interact with concepts, ideas, and processes related to the interdependences between personal, local, and global relationships.
- · diversity: think outside of cultural norms and values, including their own perspectives, to critically engage the larger world.

Assigned films and television episodes you are required to watch at home unless otherwise noted. You may rent these on iTunes, Google Play, or Amazon. Some are available on Netflix, Hulu Plus, or Amazon Prime streaming. If you do not wish to pay for rentals, most of the films and episodes will be on reserve in the library for you to borrow.

Note that the readings and films contain mature content.

## **Technology Policies**

I allow laptops, ebook readers, and tablets to be used during class for note-taking and referencing electronic materials *only*. Cell phones must stay put away for the duration of class. You may not use your cell phone as an ebook reader or to take pictures of notes.

As I find misuse of technology detracts from the classroom learning community, use of phones and misuse of computers in class may hurt your participation grade.

## **Academic Honesty**

Plagiarism, or academic dishonesty, is presenting someone else's ideas or writing as your own. You are encouraged to refer to other people's thoughts and writing, as long as you cite them. Note that plagiarism includes both a failure to cite sources *and* presenting someone else's words as your own when you do include a citation. This includes copying and pasting portions of another writer's sentence into your essay without including quotation marks *and* a citation. Most students don't mean to plagiarize, and do so by failing to understand what constitutes plagiarism. I take 10% off papers that have minor instances of plagiarism. If I suspect you have intentionally plagiarized on a larger scale (such as submitting large portions of an essay you did not write yourself), I will report you to the university for disciplinary review.

#### **Email & Grade Discussion**

Please email me from your UW email address rather than your personal email address. I am happy to discuss a grade with you in person during office hours, but I legally cannot discuss grades with you over email because email is not a private communication medium. Note that emails to teachers should be courteous, note which class you are in, and clearly state your purpose for writing.
