#### 3. Enrollment Update (12 accepted, 6 admitted/pending). Recruitment ideas?

David: We have 14 accepted and four haven't accepted the offer yet, so we're up to 18 now. Noelle: The next recruiting event at TCC is scheduled for May 25<sup>th</sup>. Matt Ford and other faculty members from other SET programs are going too, to talk with prospective students about research and their expertise in specific areas of study.
