3. Advisors' update

• David reported that we have 54 students who accepted their admission into the BA/BS CSS program and 65 students who received their acceptance letters/waiting for their confirmation. New process this year: rolling admissions – we are processing them as they come in, whereas in previous years we waited until a certain date before we processed them all at once in bulk. While this is a better process, this does not give us an accurate snapshot of where are numbers will be after the cycle. If we do have space left when we close our admission deadline in July 1, we can certainly extend it and allow more students to apply & finish their pre requisites this summer.

- Beth announced that this is the first year that we are back in person for graduation. Commencement is scheduled on Monday, June 13, 2022 at the Washington State Fair Grandstand. This year we are going to celebrate the Class of 2022, 2021 and 2020. Please plan to attend, it means a lot to our students for you to be there.
- Menaka shared that the UW campus is coordinating a roundtrip shuttle/transportation details for us & encouraged all faculty to attend.

4. Students' update

- Dustin reported that some students raised an issue about the performance of an instructor.
- Anderson shared that they are aware of the issue & they are trying to engage with the
 instructor in question. Anderson also asked Dustin to organize with the students to
 write a letter (to the CSS Program Chair and Dean of SET), stating the case &
 explaining how it affected them. The administration needs more information &
 documentation regarding the issue to find a resolution.

5. Graduate update

- Martine shared that they went over the current PhD students' annual progress reports. They identified who is doing well and who needs additional help. Ankur will reach out to those who need additional support.
- They also reviewed the application process for the graduate programs.
