#### 1. Motion: To approve the minutes from October 21, 2022

### 2. Advisors Report

- Degree Titles
  - Having 3 degree titles is confusing for students
  - Digital Forensics is no longer offered, but the major code still exists
  - The only differences between three options is 3 senior electives
- o Pre-requisites: TCSS 141 and 142
  - Should we eliminate 141 as a pre-requisite option for students?
  - Suggestion to make pre-requisites 10 credits of programming rather than just 141
  - Will revisit the conversation for next meeting
  - Keep admissions the same as is for 2023, but may update for 2024 admissions cycle
- o 250 Lab 3 lab concerns
  - Students were spending more time than expected on Lab 3. Seminar leaders spent a lot of time supporting our Juniors
  - Could this have been lack of lab support in 250 this quarter? Seminar leaders think it would help to have support in the lab
  - Students come in without prepping, which may impact lab success
