- 2. Update: Top Scholar Funding App Review, Apr 15th deadline for initial offer letters. By May 1st, unallocated funds are returned unless arrangements are made w/ the Grad School

7. Update: MSCSS Application Review – Rachel

Numbers:

MSCSS: 44 admitted, 26 denied, 58 in review, 12 submitted (missing materials)

GC-SDE: 8 applicants so far, which is actually good compared to last year, 8 admitted, 0

denied, 0 in review.

Ph.D.: 1 admitted, 13 denied, 1 in review, 5 Top Scholar prospects.

Top scholar. 5 Ph.D. students were nominated, and 1 MSCSS student was nominated, but that student has not yet applied. What does the VCAA look for to approve? The student should be qualified, and the letter should specify what funding is being offered. There is a concern for how many years a student is funded (see above discussion).

12. AY 2025-26 Course Schedule - Saturday Course Timings (?)

Chris Marriott is seeking advice for how to schedule Saturday classes. There was a discussion about the issues about this. On the one hand, we tend to have two blocks of time on Saturday (morning, afternoon). On the other hand, there are variations that make it difficult to make the Saturday times consistent (for example, different credits for courses, whether the course is offered hybrid). For AY 2025-26 scheduling, the decision was to adopt AY 2024-25 Saturday course timings and review as needed.

13. TCSS 600/700/702/800 Grading Standards: (UW Grading Policy)

The recommendation in the past is to use an N grade for the 700/702/800 for multi-quarter project/thesis/Ph.D. However, there is no policy. The general agreement now is that 700/800

is CR/NC, 600/702 is graded (numerical), and we use N (not X) for multi-quarter classes/projects, but we will use CR for 800 students. Also, we need to make sure what the system does and what we intend actually coincide.
