SPECIAL ALLOCATIONS - CRITERIA

Our proposal request falls under "emergency expenditure unforeseen" category. We are requesting an additional \$1000 to support programming.

STUDENT UTILIZATION

All of our programs have seen a significant increase over the past several years with Freshmen/Transfer Connect (annual), Registration is a Piece of Cake (quarterly), and End of Year Bash (annual). As our numbers increased significantly from past years attendance with RPC, from 8 or less to more than 40 students, and with increased fees associated with providing food at events we do anticipate needing more than expected as those estimates were not available when we first submitted for SAFC funding.

Our participants benefit from the opportunity to engage in programming that aims to be creative, innovative, culturally and socially relevant and delivered from a student perspective. HSS is a student-led organization and does not receive academic funding. Our programming is initiated by undergraduate students and is open to all new and current undergraduates and is open to being inclusive to graduate students who would also like to participate.

We are providing programming that is based on direct student feedback and involvement which allows us to create higher impact programming and achieve more than we can alone.

- A. Increase community members' awareness of how to engage UW Tacoma.
- B. Increase the number of community partnerships, including those that connect global and local communities.
- C. Improve the satisfaction of traditionally underrepresented students, especially racially/ethnic minority students, with the UW experience.

As an organization, the HSS advisory board would like to make our programming accessible and representative of all the diverse communities on campus by contributing to the variety of programming that is offered on campus.

All Special Allocation funds go directly towards student serving events. The Special Allocations funds will be quickly implemented to pay current and future programming to ensure we are firmly aligning the mission of HSS with UW Tacoma's Strategic Plan in the following ways:
