SPECIAL ALLOCATIONS - CRITERIA

Our proposal request falls under "emergency expenditure unforeseen" category. We are requesting an additional \$1000 to support programming.

All of our programs have seen a significant increase over the past several years with (FTC) Freshmen/Transfer Connect 150 students, End of Year Celebration which sees between 100 to 150 students, (RPC) Registration is a piece of cake hosted 2x quarterly and serving 189 students to date, as well as Winter Warming 50 students, and other partnerships. As our numbers increased significantly from past years attendance and with increased costs and fees associated with providing food at events we do anticipate needing more than expected as those estimates were not available when we first submitted for SAFC funding. We estimate serving 500+ students with direct and partner programming and implementation.

HSS is a student-led organization and does not receive academic funding. STUDENT UTILIZATION

Our participants benefit from the opportunity to engage in programming that aims to be creative, innovative, culturally and socially relevant and delivered from a student perspective. HSS is a student-led organization and does not receive academic funding. Our programming is initiated by undergraduate students and is open to all new and current undergraduates and is open to being inclusive to graduate students who would also like to participate.

Our annual Freshmen/Transfer Connect Event served 150+ students which is the largest number we have served to date, incorporated surrounding communities and businesses from Pac Ave, and partnered with student leaders from six campus organizations to offer unique opportunities to student leaders from different programs to cross collaborate on programming. Our RPC Event serves 189 students to date, Winter Warming 'our inaugural event' 50 students, and the End Of Year celebration is projected to serve between 100 to 200 students. We estimate serving 500+ students with direct and partner programming and implementation.
