- ✓ Unlike the previous version of MLA, the **8th ed.** uses a container system for creating citations (pictured left).
- ✓ The container system presents **core elements** of the source. The **author** and **title** are most important. They are emphasized by being placed first and separated by periods. The other container elements are separated by commas to show their connection.
- ✓ Not all of these elements will apply to every source. Skip the ones that you don't need and move to the next element in the list.
- ✓ Because of the **flexibility** of this system, generating a citation will depend both on source type and how the writer accessed the source.
- ✓ The following pages in this guide provide **examples** of many of the most common types of source citations. Consult the MLA Handbook (8th ed.) for other source types.
